Morning Overview

Lesson: The Great Commission

Lesson Objective: To communicate to children that God always keeps His promises despite circumstances and even our inability to trust Him. God kept His greatest and best promise by sending His Son, Jesus, to rescue us from our sins.

In our lesson today, we begin to bring the earthly ministry of Christ to a close. This week, and next, we will parcel out the Great Commission and Christ's Ascension. Today we want the children to hear and understand that Jesus commanded the disciples to go throughout the world, sharing the Good News, baptizing in the name of the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit, and teaching everyone to obey what Jesus taught. This is not possible by our own human ability; in fact it would fail, so the Holy Spirit is sent to empower Christ's disciples to share the Good News and to be with them as they go everywhere as witnesses to Christ's life, death and resurrection.

Opening Activity: Hedbanz *Craft:* Good News Feet

Supplies: Left and right foot, peel and stick magnets

Instructions: 1. Have child draw a picture of themselves on right foot.

2. Color both feet.

3. Attach magnet to back of both feet.

Relay of the Day: Teach Acts 1:8 motions to the children

But you will receive power - make strong arms

when the Holy Spirit has come upon you - make the wings of a bird with your hands by attaching your thumbs and fluttering your fingers from above your head down to your rest over your heart

and you will be my witnesses - raise your right hand like you are swearing in and then open and close your hand as if you were making a puppet speak

in Jerusalem - make a small circle with your hand around your heart

and in all Judea - make a larger circle around your heart

and Samaria, - make a big circle over your head

and to the end of the earth. - open your arms and turn around

Story: The Great Commision

- 1. **PRAY** for your time and any requests the children may have.
- 2. **ASK** the transition question: Boys and girls, if you could go anywhere in the world, where would you go? In our story today, Jesus commands His disciples to go to all the places you just named! But they had a very important job to do in those places. Let's find out from our story what the disciples very important job was...
- 3. **TELL** the Story. Use the Vos Children's Bible, the Jesus Storybook Bible, the Beginner's Bible, or the story below to aid in telling the story. Feel free to edit and adapt to your own style. Include props and teaching aids as you see fit.
- 4. **REVIEW** the questions to help children understand the story.

Teaching Summary:

- God's promises do not change despite circumstances, people and even our inability to believe them. God keeps His promises even when we do not trust Him or follow His commands.
- For many, many years God's people expected the Promised One a King to come and make all things right.
- Jesus instructs His disciples to meet Him in Galilee. This will be the final time Jesus meets with His disciples before He leaves the earth.
- Jesus gives some very specific instructions to His disciples and a few promises too.
- Jesus commands His disciples to go throughout the world telling everyone the Good News, baptizing them in the name of the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey all that Jesus had commanded the disciples.
- Jesus promised that His disciples would not be alone and would have help. Help would come from the Holy Spirit.

Story

Transition

Boys and girls, if you could go anywhere in the world, where would you go? In our story today, Jesus commands His disciples to go to all the places you just named! But they had a very important job to do in those places. Let's find out from our story what the disciples very important job was...

Forty Days and Five Hundred People

Many people had seen Jesus after He had risen from the dead. They touched his scars, poked him, saw Him eat food, and even walked and talked with Him. There was no question in anyone's mind that Jesus was really alive! Jesus did all of this for forty (40) days after He rose from the dead. During this time after Jesus rose from the dead, He appeared to more than five hundred people (1 Corinthians 15:6)! But God's plan was not for Jesus to stay here on earth. Before Jesus would leave, he had some important commands and promises to give to His disciples.

The Great Commission

Jesus commanded his eleven disciples to meet him in Galilee. The disciples came to a mountain where they saw Jesus and there they worshipped Him. Some of the disciples did not believe that it was really Jesus though. But Jesus came near to them, then they really believed it was Him. Jesus gathered His disciples together and said very, very important things.

"All power in heaven and on earth is given to me." Jesus had received all power from His Father in Heaven, and now He was telling His disciples where to go and what to do. What kind of power? It was the power to send His disciples out and that the Good News they would tell others would be heard and believed.

What was the Good News? Jesus told the disciples, "Tell the Good News to everyone. It is written that the Christ would be killed and rise from death on the third day. You saw these things happen—you are witnesses. You must tell people to change their hearts and lives. If they do this, their sins will be forgiven. Teach them to obey everything that I have told you." Other people in the world had never heard of Jesus; they did not hear about His crucifixion or His resurrection. They did not have a relationship with God at all! Jesus wanted people to hear this Good News!

But where would they go to tell the Good News?

Jesus said to the disciples: "Go everywhere in the world and make followers of all people!" Jesus wanted everyone to hear the Good News. However, Jesus wanted the disciples to start telling people in Jerusalem first. And the disciples could not leave Jerusalem until a Special Helper come. The Special Helper would be the Holy Spirit. The Holy Spirit would come after Jesus went away. Jesus had told them that it was good for them if He went away because then the Holy Spirit would come and live inside of His followers. Jesus had promised that the Holy Spirit would never leave God's people, but the Holy Spirit would always be with them.

Not only would the disciples tell everyone the Good News, but Jesus commanded the disciples to baptize everyone in the name of the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit.

Some of the last words we have from Jesus to His disciples were, "You can be sure that I will be with you always. I will continue with you until the end of the world." As the disciples go out into the world telling everyone about Jesus, Jesus wanted them to know they would never be alone. This is a great promise and comfort as we go out and tell others about Jesus!

Questions for Review

Questions for Younger Children:

- How many days did Jesus stay on earth after He rose from the dead?
- How many people saw Jesus after He rose from the dead?
- Where did Jesus command His disciples to stay?
- Who did Jesus promise would come once He left?
- Where were the disciples to go once they received the Holy Spirit?
- What were they to tell everyone?
- What were the disciples to do as they went throughout the world?
- What did Jesus promise to His disciples before He left?

Questions for Older Children:

- What does the story tell us about God?
- What does this story tell us about God's faithfulness?
- What does this story tell us about God's love for us?
